The Second Course includes opportunities for training and ongoing formation for those in ministry which can be provided by the Diocese on a Partnership/Deanery basis.

The Third Course has options for following up after the training to ensure that ministry is well established in the parish.

Thursday evenings for the Pathways Adult Faith Development Programme resume on Thursday 11th April after the two week Easter Break. We are now into our final term, for this year, before the summer break at the end of May.

We have a number of interesting topics coming up this month.

Our First Years will be exploring: 'The Christian Vision of Life after Death' - a very appropriate topic in this season of the Resurrection, Eastertide! They will also be exploring the issue of 'Parish Pastoral Councils' and we will have the first of two sessions on: 'Sacraments: Marking Life's Moments'.

Second Years will continue to explore various pastoral issues today, including: 'World Faiths and Inter-Religious Dialogue'; 'Practical Liturgy: Understanding the Eucharist' and 'The Writings and Teachings of Pope Francis'.

An important date in our Pathways diary this month is our Come Rest Awhile Retreat Day, which will be taking place in DCU St. Patrick's Campus on Saturday 27th April. This quiet, reflective day will be directed and led by two members of the Partners in Faith organisation. The day will conclude with a celebration of the Eucharist. Our celebrant will be one of our past Pathways participants. It will be a day to look forward to – a day for ourselves to deepen and nourish our faith, and our personal relationship with God.

Preparations are underway for the next Pathways course (2024-2026), starting in September, and details of how to register will be available soon.


FIRST COURSE

Voluntary Ministry Matters

Spending time studying the resource to decide which aspect of ministry to focus on: Laying foundations, Recruitment, Training etc.

Parish Ministry Audit

Take some time to find out what is happening in the various ministry groups, what is needed and what is missing in the parish.



Ministry Recruitment

Using different ways of promoting ministry, including multimedia and personal invitation.

SECOND COURSE

Parish Pastoral Council

A 4 hour training session offers initial training for new PPCs or a renewal for existing councils, developing pastoral leadership, vision and prayerful decision making for the parish community.

Ministers of the Word

This 2 hour training session presents best practice and guidance for those proclaiming God's word. Exploring what this ministry is about, it lays the foundation for further inparish practice.

Ministers of Holy Communion

This training takes 2 hours and provides an understanding of what is at the heart of this parish ministry as well as looking at some of the practicalities involved.

Funeral Team Ministry

Over 3 sessions, these 2 hour trainings explore Diocesan Policy, the Order of Christian Funerals and its various Rites, the ministry of accompaniment and the importance of Team. The final session includes the planning and preparation of funerals with families.

Leading a Liturgy of the Word

Two initial 2 hour sessions will help in understanding the context, as well as outlining a model, for weekday liturgies led by lay people. A further practical session can also be offered to those seeking to lead these communal prayer moments.

THIRD COURSE

Appointing Team Leaders

Developing a team ministry approach by choosing people to lead each ministry group.

Commissioning Ministers

Making ministry more visible by commissioning ministry groups at Sunday Masses during the year.

Days of Reflection for Ministers

Creating times and spaces for those in ministry to reflect and pray together.


Congratulations to those who will receive the Diocesan Certificate in Catechesis in Donnybrook parish on the 21st April.

Registration will close as soon as we have 60 participants registered. This is the maximum number we can currently accommodate.








Youth & Young Adult Ministry

Laudato Si' Award




The Laudato Si' Award is for youth and young adults who want to live out their Christian calling to protect and care for God's Creation. The award builds from bronze to silver to gold level and can be completed in 3 consecutive years or when the time is right. It integrates and connects young people with the parish community and wider Diocesan family to work together to create an environment of care and protection in parishes.

19 February Seven Ways to Pray in Lent


Ideas shared by the DCU Chaplaincy Students (Full-time) to enrich prayer moments during the season of Lent.
