Adult Faith Ministry

Pathways is a course for adults who want to explore their faith and grow in understanding and confidence. It's also a great way to reflect on ministry and participation in the life of the Church.

Each evening over the two years follows a similar format which includes a time of prayer and a presentation on a variety of areas of faith and ministry. This is followed by small group sharing and reflection on the theme, with an opportunity to bring questions and insights to the larger group.


The course has no exams or written work but relies on an openness to learn new things in new ways, as well as share thoughts and experiences together with others.

The areas of faith and ministry included in the course include scripture, liturgy, sacraments, images of God, ministries, parish, what is church?, Vatican II, care of creation, young people, role of the laity and much more.

Help with the cost may be available from your parish or from the diocese.

PARISH MINISTR



This 2 hour training session presents best guidance and for practice those proclaiming God's word. Exploring what this ministry is about it lays the foundation for further in-parish practice.

This training takes 2 hours and provides an understanding of what is at the heart of this parish ministry as well as looking at some of the practicalities involved





Two initial 2 hour sessions will help in understanding the context, as well as outlining a model, for weekday liturgies led by lay people. A further practical session can also be offered to those seeking to lead these communal prayer moments

Three sessions, of 2 hours, explore Diocesan Policy, the Order of Christian Funerals and its various Rites, the ministry of accompaniment, the importance of Team as well as the planning and preparation of funerals with families. Further training is available for Funeral Leaders





Music Workshop


A time to gather all youth choirs within the Diocese for a day of song and showcasing all the amazing talent.






MUSIC NOTES from the LitMus Office


