

This 2 hour training session presents best practice and guidance for those proclaiming God's word. Exploring what this ministry is about it lays the foundation for further in-parish practice.

This training takes 2 hours and provides an understanding of what is at the heart of this parish ministry as well as looking at some of the practicalities involved. Ministers of Holy Communion



Over 3 sessions, these 2 hour trainings explore Diocesan Policy, the Order of Christian Funerals and its various Rites, the ministry of accompaniment and the importance of Team. The final session includes the planning and preparation of funerals with families.

Two initial 2 hour sessions will help in understanding the context, as well as outlining a model, for weekday liturgies led by lay people. A further practical session can also be offered to those seeking to lead these communal prayer moments.

Topics covered included: Making Moral Decisions; Faith and Values (both topics very relevant for the upcoming referendum!); Listening to God in Everyday Life; Ecumenism; Celtic Spirituality; and Women in the Church.

In the coming weeks some of the topics to be covered are: Church and Parish: community of Faith; The Role of the Laity in the Church; Family Ministry; Ecology and Creation Theology; and Young People and Faith Today.

I can see now how we need to develop new ways to accompany families who come from all different kinds of households of faith.


As the Accompanying Families Policy states we need to grasp the fact that families are not there for the Church project but we need to realise as a Church that we are here for the family project.'

Pointers for PPC Prayer!

As a faith-filled leadership team, one of the most important parts of any PPC gathering is spending time together in prayer. It is this prayerful approach which guides all the work and decisions of the PPC. Here are a few handy hints to develop your prayertime at meetings:

- Make a time of prayer a priority rather than saying a prayer at the start of your meeting.
- Work in pairs to take responsibility for planning and leading the prayer
- Create a simple focal point or sacred space to gather round this might include a bible, a candle, a religious symbol or icon that reflects the theme of the prayer or the liturgical year
- Don't be afraid of using silence when you pray
- Give your time of prayer a structure: a beginning, a middle and an end
- Remember that this is communal prayer so find way for people to participate
- Create a PPC Prayer Box which has different (liturgical) coloured cloths, a bible, a cross, candles, matches etc. that can be used by those preparing the prayer
- Remember that prayer is an important part of discernment and good decision making so be prepared to prayer at different moments of the meeting when it's needed.




